On motion of Vice Chairman Skrmetta, seconded by Commissioner Lewis, with Commissioner Campbell and Commissioner Coussan concurring, and Chairman Francis abstaining, the Commission voted to ratify Chairman Francis' votes cast on November 3, 3025 as the Louisiana Public Service Commission representative to the SPP RSC.

On motion of Commissioner Lewis, seconded by Vice Chairman Skrmetta, and unanimously adopted, the Commission voted to ratify the interventions taken on the Commission's behalf in FERC Dockets ER25-3515, ER25-3516, ER25-3543, ER25-3560, ER25-3570 and ER26-139.

### 5) Directives

Directive to Louisiana jurisdictional investor-owned electric utilities regarding nuclear power.

## At the request of Vice Chairman Skrmetta.

The directive read as follows: Pursuant to the Commission's constitutional authority to ensure reliable, long-term energy resources and in support of state and federal energy policy, all investor-owned electric utilities, subject to this Commission's jurisdiction, are hereby directed to evaluate prudent locations within the state for future nuclear power plants. The IOUs are to report back to the Commission within 90 days with a preliminary plan to either initiate an early site permit or combined construction and operating license application with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission under 10 C.F.R. Part 52 for potential new nuclear generation sites. This directive is not intended to trigger Commission General Order dated May 18, 2007 regarding ratemaking and generation planning for nuclear power plants; actual applications for site approval will be determined after presentations by the IOUs regarding suggested future sites.

With Chairman Francis, Vice Chairman Skrmetta, Commissioner Lewis, Commissioner Coussan concurring, and Commission Campbell opposing, the directive passed 4:1.

Directive to Louisiana jurisdictional water systems on water balance and unaccounted for water.

## At the request of Vice Chairman Skrmetta.

The directive read as follows: To enhance system efficiency, reduce non-revenue water loss, and inform future infrastructure planning, the Louisiana Public Service Commission hereby establishes a standardized quarterly reporting requirement for all regulated drinking water systems under its jurisdiction. This directive enables the identification and quantification of water leakage, operational losses, and unaccounted-for water, supporting data-driven decisions on pipeline rehabilitation, replacement, and resource conservation.

Effective January 1, 2026, and continuing each quarter thereafter, every jurisdictional public drinking water system shall submit a Quarterly Water Balance Report containing the following data for the preceding calendar quarter:

1. Total Volume of Fresh Water Introduced into the System (source water intake, in gallons);

- 2. Total Volume of Fresh Water Delivered to Customers (billed metered consumption, in gallons); and
- 3. Differential Volume of Unaccounted-For Water (calculated as intake minus delivered volume, expressed in gallons and as a percentage of total intake).

Reports shall be filed electronically in the format prescribed by the Commission's Utility Division no later than 30 days after the end of each calendar quarter (i.e., April 30, July 30, October 30, and January 30).

The Utilities Division shall develop and distribute standardized reporting templates, instructions, and submission protocols by January 15, 2026. In addition, the Utilities Division shall conduct reviews and provide technical assistance to utilities as needed to ensure accurate and consistent reporting.

Jurisdictional water systems shall maintain supporting records (e.g., production logs, meter readings, leak detection reports) for a minimum of three (3) years and make them available to the Commission upon request.

No additional contracts for hire are anticipated to implement this directive. However, if operational demands exceed current staffing capacity, the Executive Secretary is authorized to prepare and present to the Commission a formal request for supplemental personnel or resources, accompanied by a detailed justification and cost analysis.

There was no opposition to the directive.
